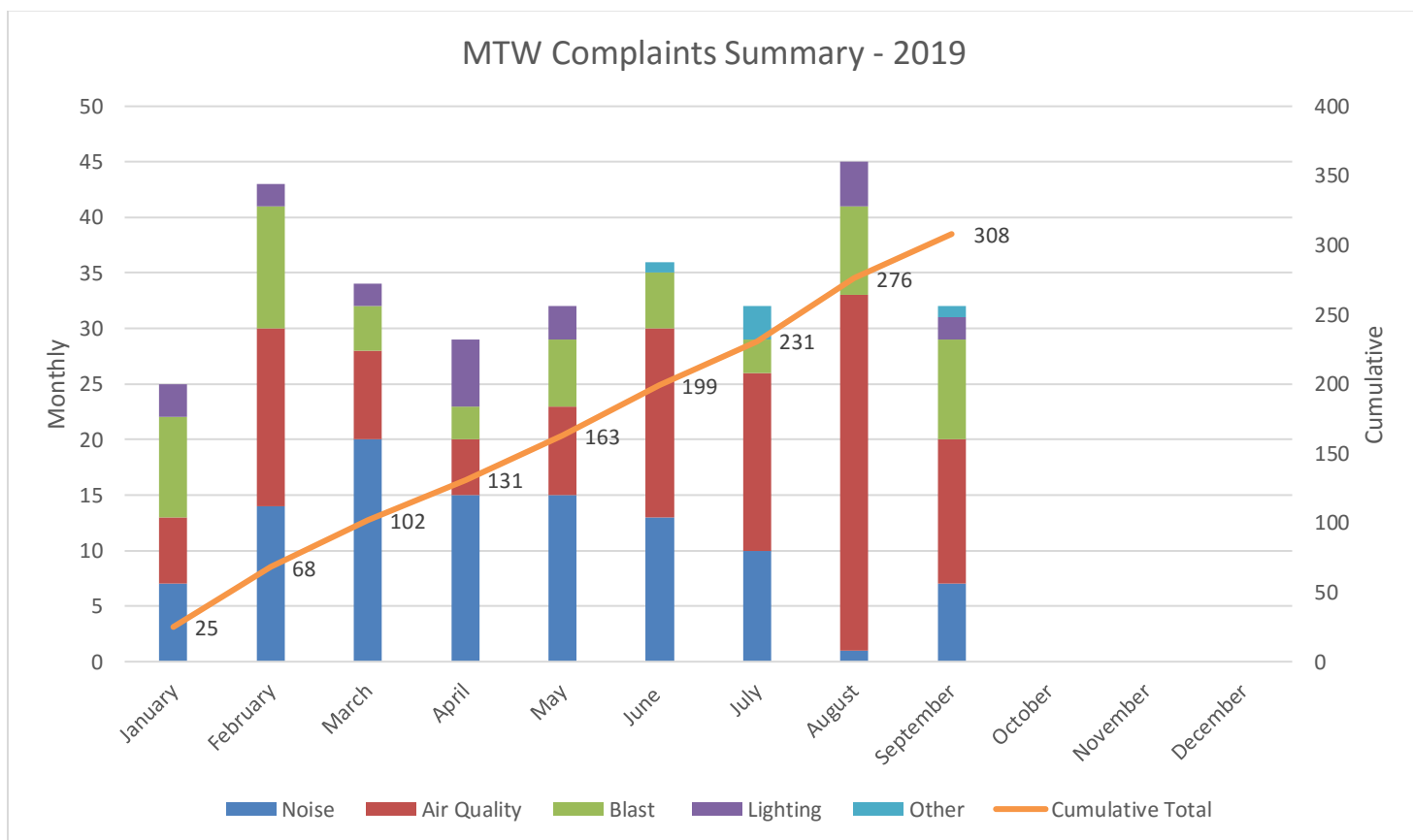

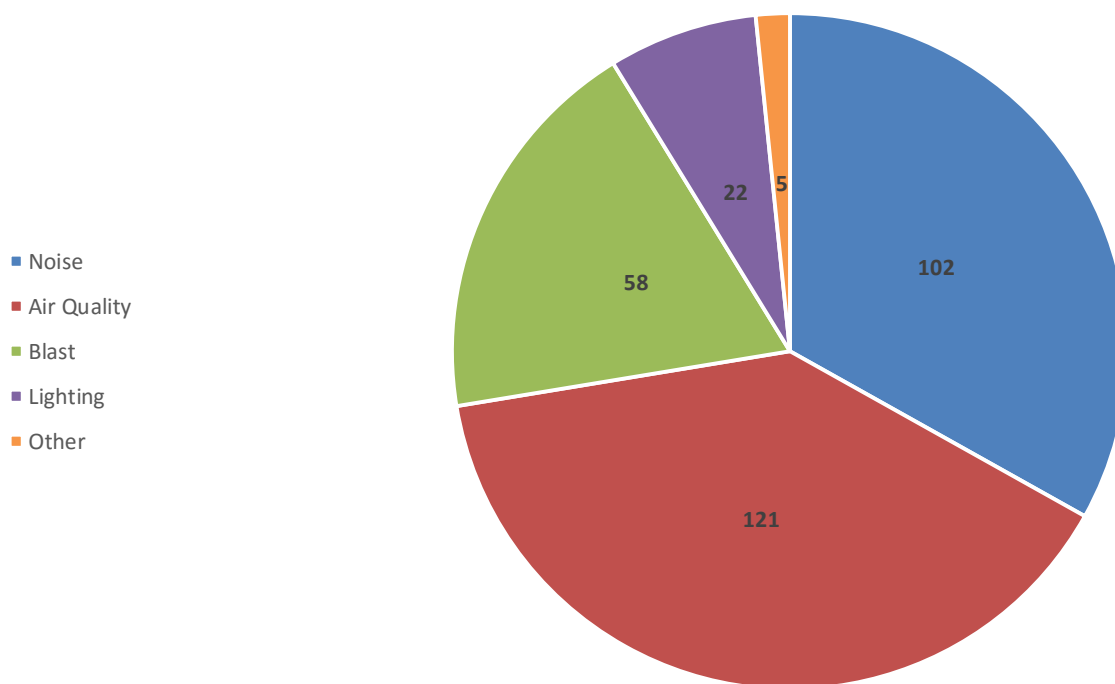

Complaints overview for period – 1 July 2019 to 30 September 2019



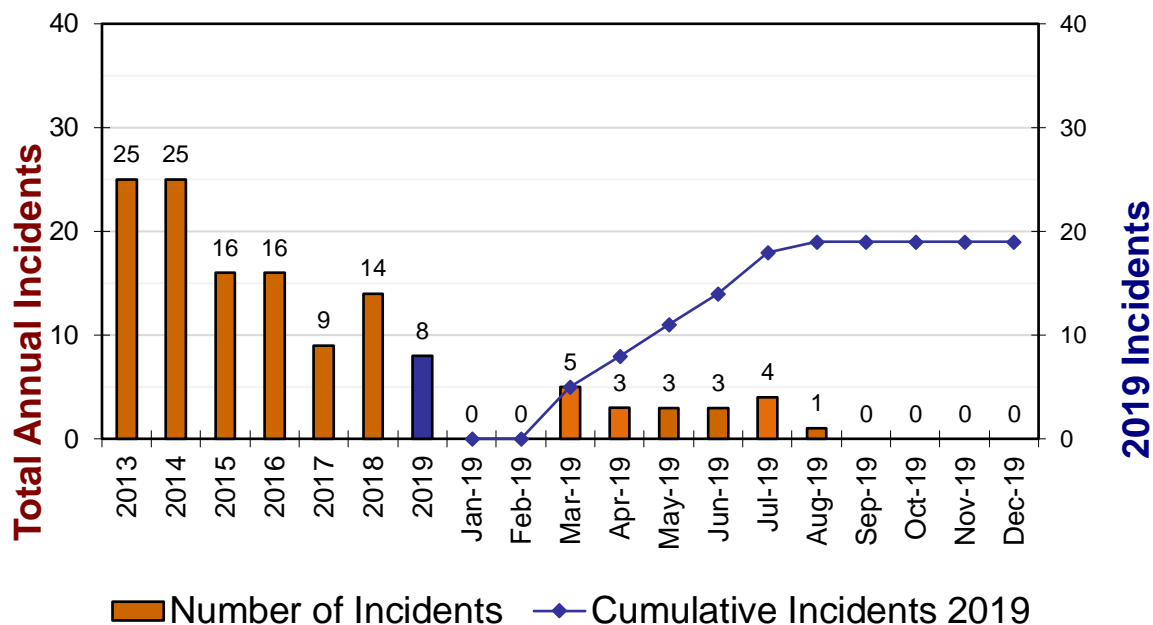
Complaints by Type 2019

Incident Summary for the period 1 July 2019 to 30 September 2019.

Date	Details	Key Actions	Aspect
03/07/2019	During a supply service a contractor grease vehicle spilt approximately 200kg of grease onto the ground at the Loders Pit Trans-tank area.	Supply service ceased immediately whilst the spill was controlled, contained and cleaned up. Relevant supervisors notified, incident investigated.	Hydrocarbon
19/07/2019	A fluctuation in flow rate on tailings line 1 was detected by a CHPP operator. Upon inspection, leaks were detected at both pressure gauge spigots.	All spillage was contained within the designated tailing storage cells. Tailings lines affected were shut down and isolated to allow repair works to commence. Relevant supervisors notified.	Water

Date	Details	Key Actions	Aspect
25/07/2019	Upon commencing the operation of a dredge pump to discharge material, a leak was detected on the discharge line, releasing approximately 50L of slurry onto the ground	Dredging pump ceased operation immediately whilst the spill was controlled, contained within site dirty water management system, and cleaned up. Relevant supervisors were notified. Repair works completed on the discharge pipeline, prior to further dredging.	Water
30/07/2019	MTW was advised by National Parks and Wildlife Services (NPWS) that a recently extinguished bushfire may have impacted part of the Putty Biodiversity Offset Area	Upon inspection, it was confirmed that the offset area had been partially impacted. Contractor engaged as per management plan requirements to undertake an impact damage assessment of the region.	Biodiversity
07/08/2019	A blast dust event occurred at WML. The resulting blast dust plume travelled over Putty Road, and the Mount Thorley Industrial Estate before dissipating over farmland east of MTW.	Relevant supervisors notified. Formal report compiled for the EPA. Investigation undertaken, which indicated the blast was undertaken in accordance with approved Blast Management Plan processes, however, in response to this event, a review and proposed changes to MTW's internal blast operating procedures has occurred to prevent or mitigate a recurrence of this event.	Air Quality

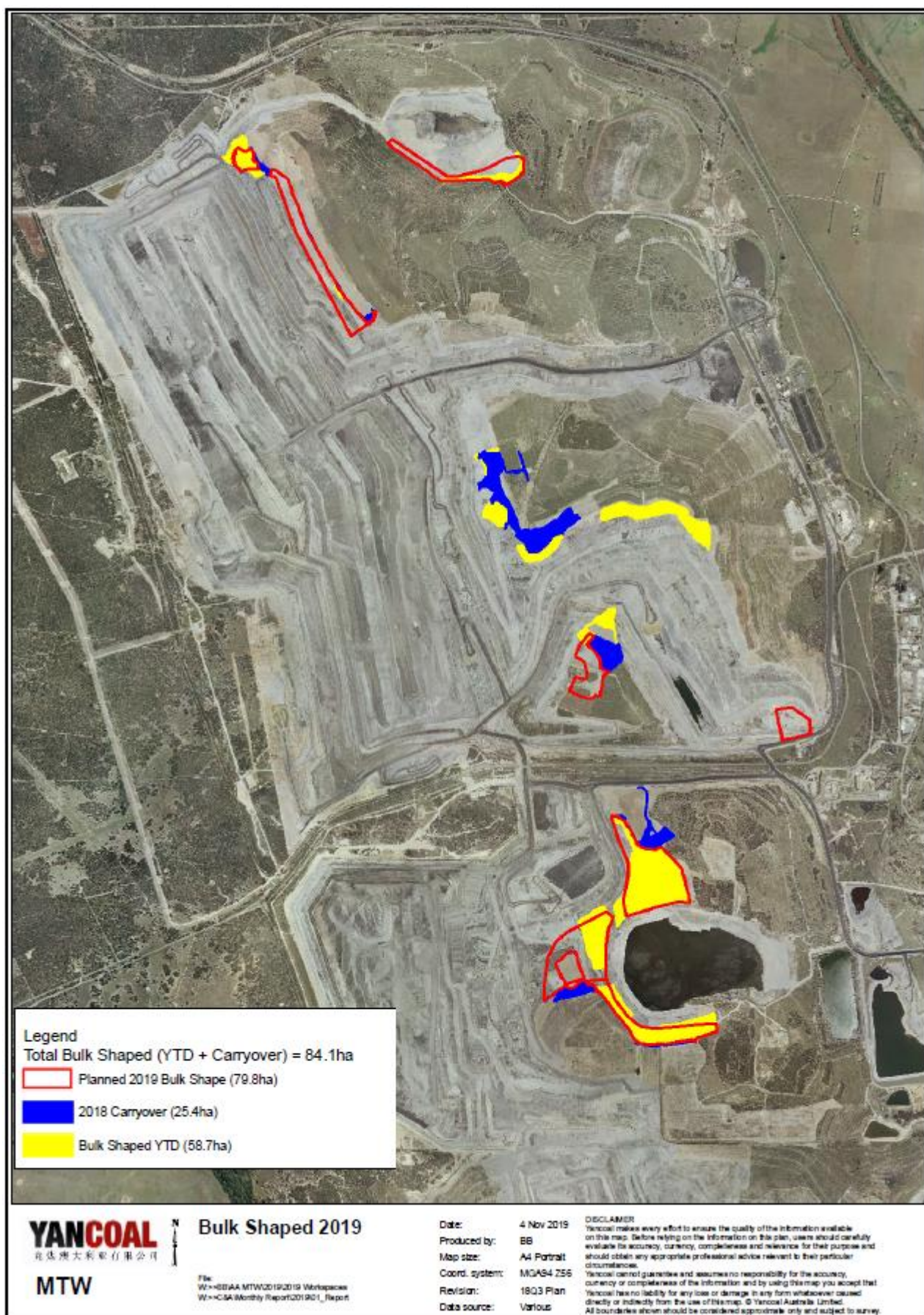

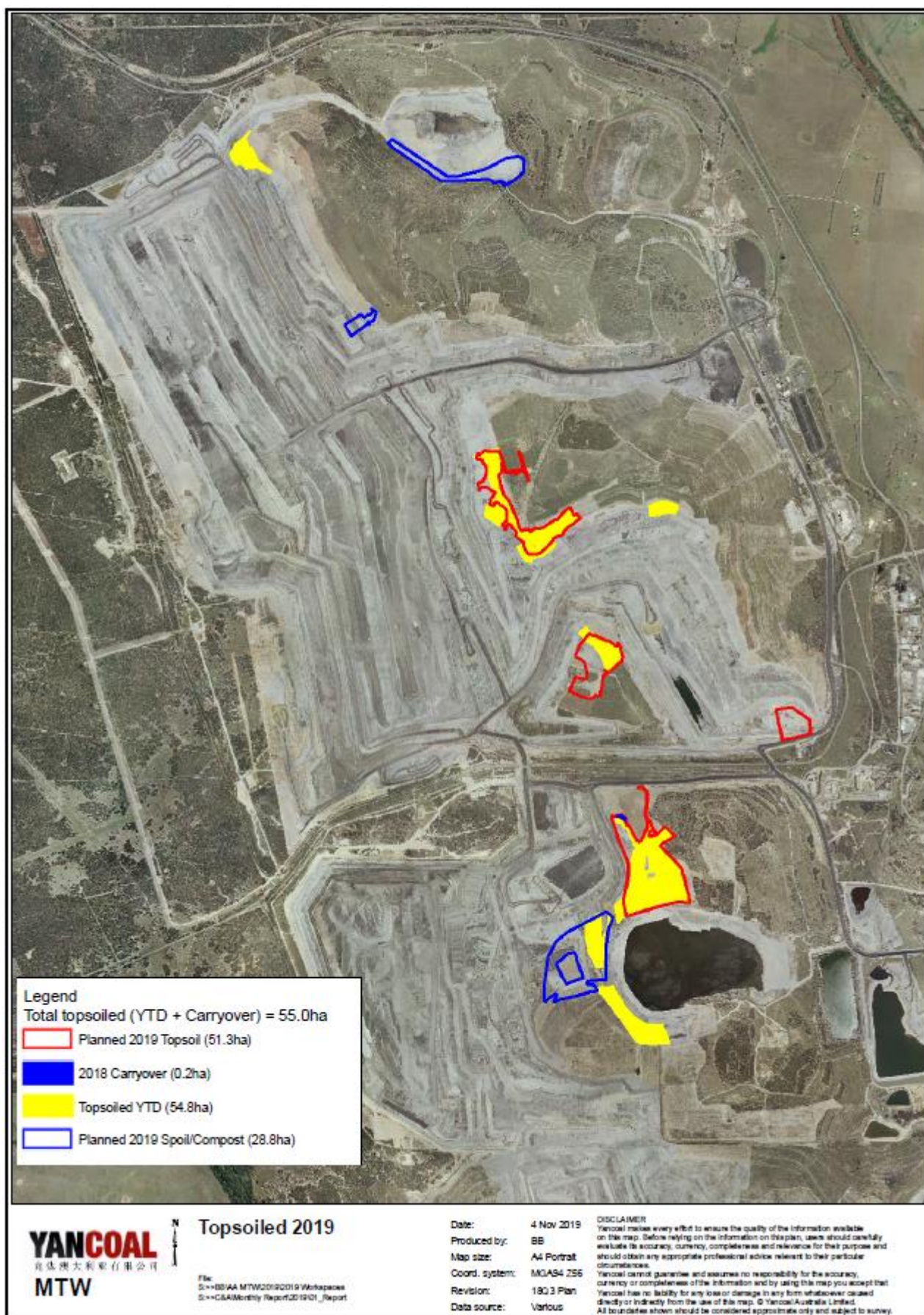
4 REHABILITATION PLAN

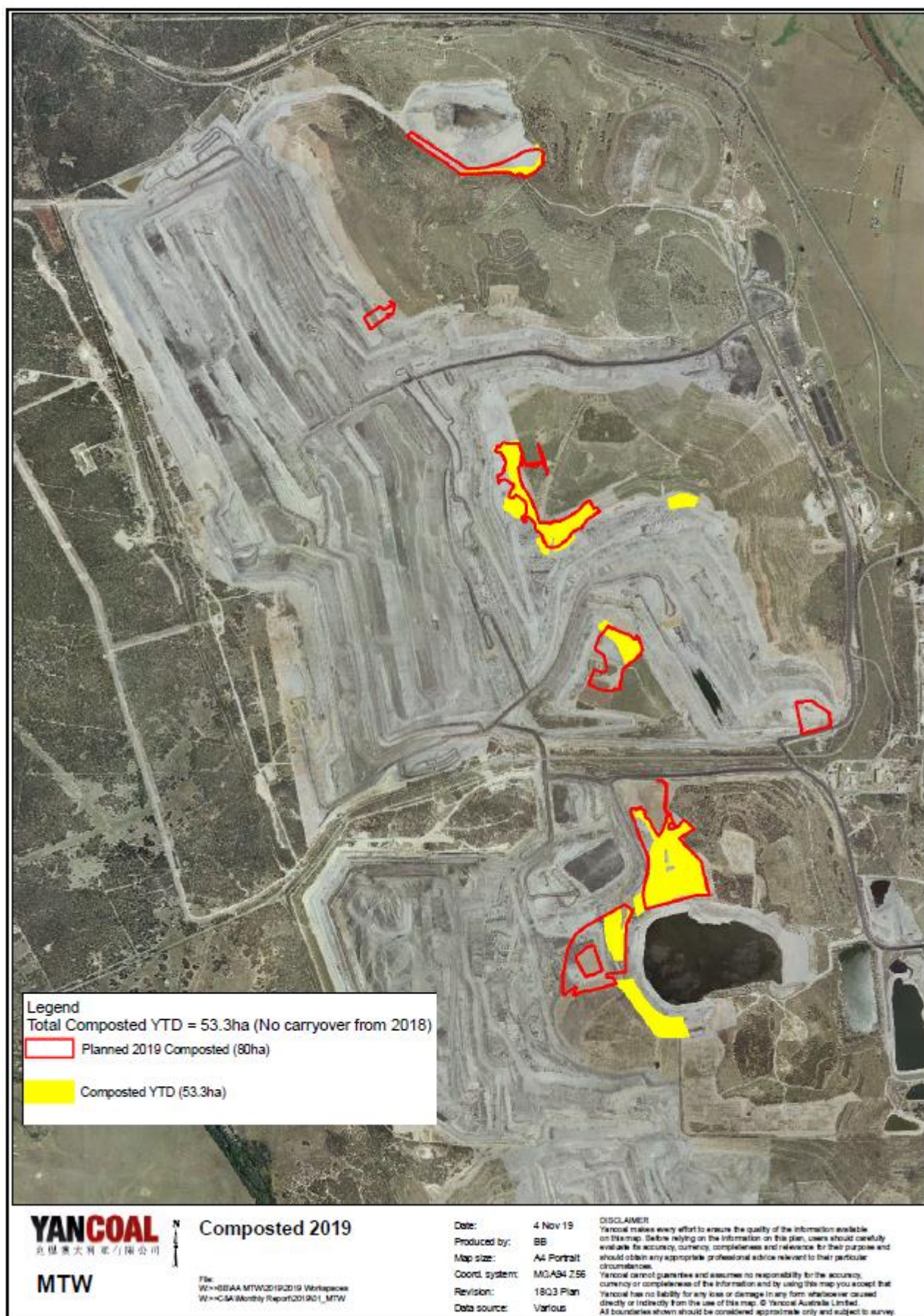
The rehabilitation target for 2019 is 80ha and the planned total disturbance ahead of mining is 64ha.

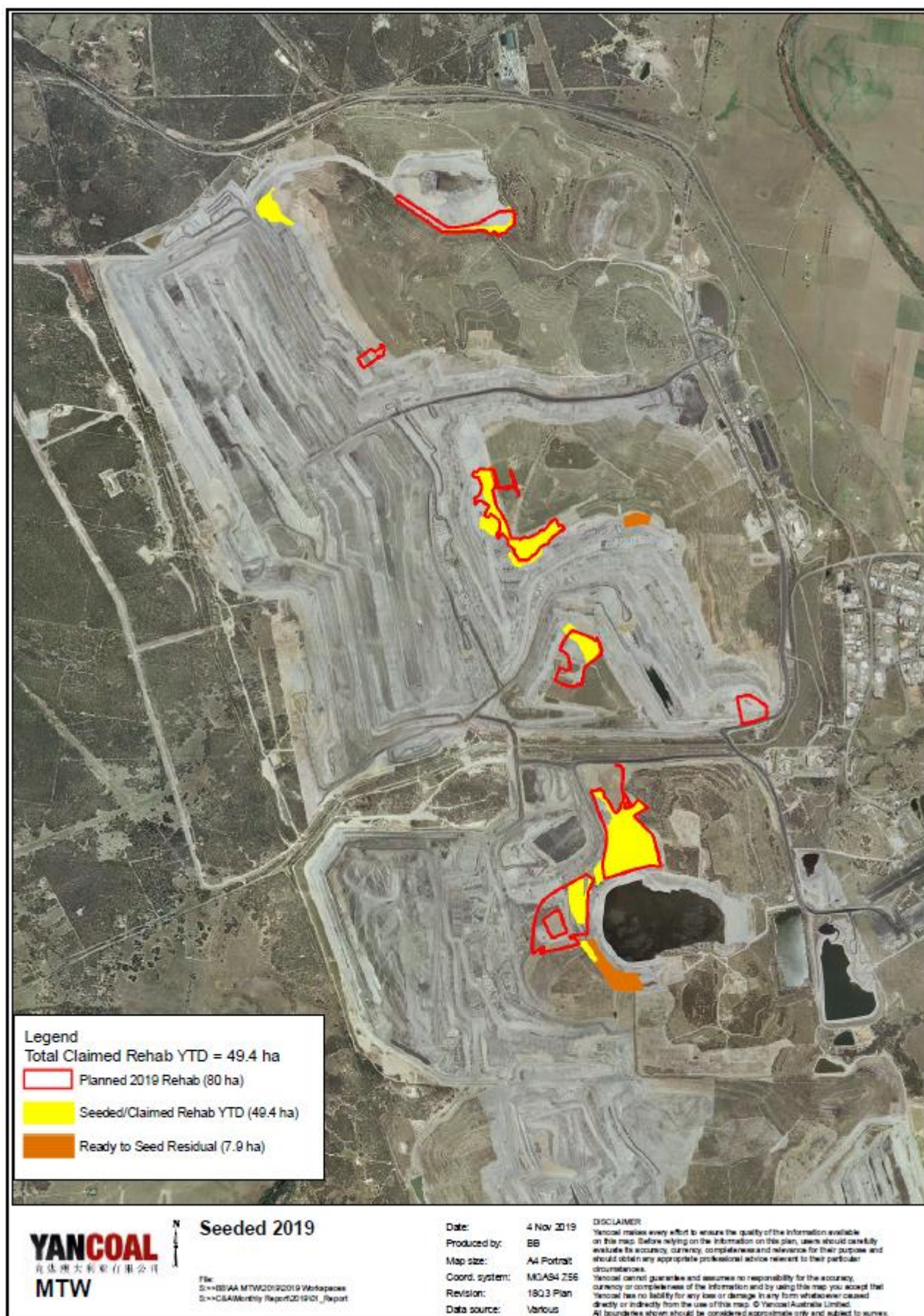
At the end of October there was 49.4 ha of rehabilitation area on which seeding had been completed. An additional 7.9ha was ready to seed, having been spread with soil ameliorants (compost and gypsum). The remaining 20ha of rehabilitation, required to meet the 2019, target will come from the CD dump area where areas are currently being bulk shaped and rock-raked in preparation for rehabilitation.

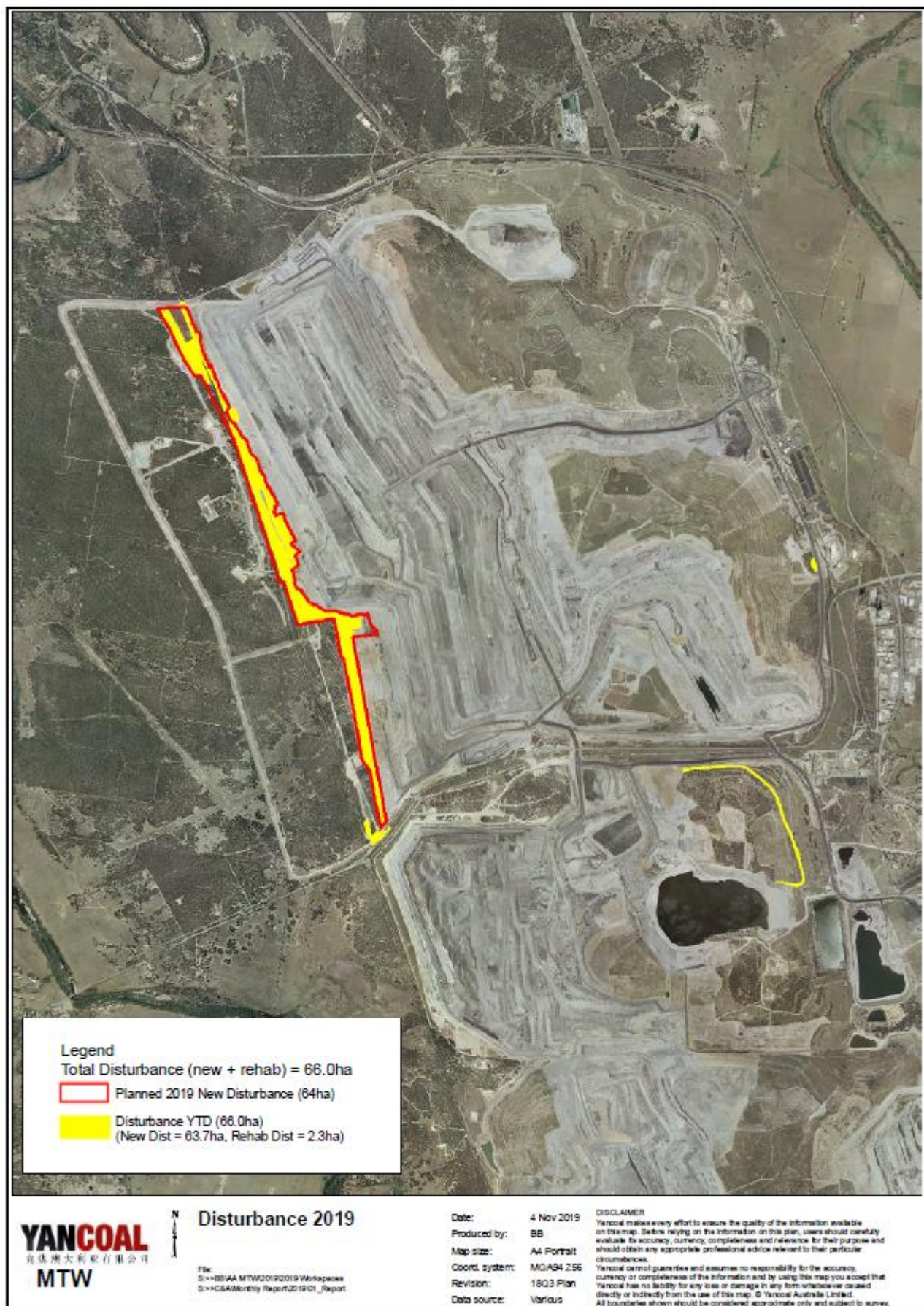
Disturbance that has been completed to the end of October totals 65.9ha and is mainly associated with clearing ahead of mining in North Pit and West Pit. A small amount of rehabilitation disturbance (2ha) has been undertaken to lay tailings pipelines to the planned Loders Pit Tailings Storage Facility.
